Subject:- Grant of 3rd Renewal of Permission to Smt. Shantadevi Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/Po-Badagandi, Tq-Bilagi, Dist-Bagalkot-587116, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0800) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Smt. Shantadevi Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/Po-Badagandi, Tq-Bilagi, Dist-Bagalkot-587116, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0800)** inspection was conducted on **15.04.2025 and 16.04.2025 on hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, to process the **3rd Renewal of Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
2. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024 ", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to the following shortcoming:**

a) Mean of general and essential equipment's/instruments availability is 98.97%

3. The assessment report was duly placed before the **130th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 03.07.2025** and Board observed that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulation. Further the Board also concluded that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations 2024, as the Letter of Permission was issued to the college from the academic year 2022-23 and the first batch was admitted in the academic year 2022-23. Hence, the Board decided to issue **3rd Renewal of Permission in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 20.01.2025 with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.**

"DECISION"

4. Therefore, **Smt. Shantadevi Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/Po-Badagandi, Tq-Bilagi, Dist-Bagalkot-587116, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0800)** is hereby granted with **3rd Renewal of Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.**
5. The aforementioned permission is issued under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
 - I. It is informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

7. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
9. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 64 of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 30th November, 2025 to get considered for the issuance of Renewal of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) The compliance of shortcoming mentioned in para- 02.
10. The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of 4th batch of students in the 1st professional BAMS is made under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
11. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time in accordance with the Regulation (66) of MESAR 2024 which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
12. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the renewal of permission for the academic session 2026-27.
